Caton does not independently determine or verify the mine, country of origin, smelter, or refiner associated with 3TG contained in purchased components and materials.

Any conflict-minerals or CMRT information provided by Caton is limited to information reasonably available to Caton from its manufacturers and suppliers. Unless specifically confirmed by Caton in writing for an identified product or part number, Caton does not represent or certify that its products are "conflict free" or that the origin of all 3TG contained in its supply chain has been determined.
